

Junior Equi-Lease

If true horse ownership is just not what your family is able to do, this is the next best thing for your horse-crazy kid! The Greenacres Equine Center Junior Equi-Lease Program will give your little rider all the “barn-time” they desire.

To participate in the program riders must have ridden at Greenacres Equine Center for at least one ten week session and have passed Levels 1, 2 & 3 written and riding tests. Riders must be current members in good standing of the US Pony Club and Greenacres Pony Club.

Includes:

1. 1 Lesson per Week Spring/Fall Sessions(10 lessons) or 2 Lessons per week Summer Session
2. Unlimited Open Rides (ride times must be scheduled in advance each week)
3. Horse Usage fees waived for Pony Club mounted meetings (3-5 per session)
4. Access to all Pony Club related activities – Horse Usage Fees Waived (shows, ratings & rallies)*

* *Additional fees may apply for shows, ratings, rallies- hauling, entries, trainer fees, etc.*

Fees:

Jr. Lease \$1100 per session (10 week sessions available: Spring / Fall)

Summer Jr. Equi-Lease \$700 (per 5 week session- 2 Summer sessions offered)

FAQ

1. How are Jr. Equi-Lease Lessons run?
 - a. Jr. Equi-Lease lessons are run the same way regular session lessons are run. Riders select their lesson times for each week, make-ups are *offered* for any lessons cancelled due to weather (any lessons not completed by the end of the session will be forfeited).
2. How many Open Rides can I do per week?
 - a. Stable hours are Tuesday – Friday 3pm-7pm; Saturday 9am-12:30pm (may vary by season). You can do one open ride per day on the days you do not have a lesson. You may ride anytime during stable hours.
3. How do I select my horse?
 - a. The riders/parents and the Center Director will meet to discuss available horses that would be the best fit for the rider. Riders are allowed to request horses, but final horse selection will be at the discretion of the Center Director.
4. What happens if my horse gets hurt/goes lame?
 - a. Inform the Center Director immediately if you notice any irregularities in your horse. The Center will supply the rider with an alternative horse for the period of time in which it takes the leased horse to recover for the injury/lameness.
5. What do I need to have to lease?
 - a. The Center will provide all tack and grooming supplies for the leased horse. Riders are welcome to purchase and use any personal tack, as long as the tack is inspected for proper fit to the horse by the Center Director before using.
6. Will my horse still be used in lessons?
 - a. Riders will schedule their Open Rides at the start of each week on the Jr. Lease Open Rides whiteboard. We will make every effort to make your leased horse available to you during your open rides. Challenges will occasionally come up, if conflicts for a specific horse arise, the Center will provide a horse for the rider’s Open Ride. Riding different horses occasionally will only succeed at making a rider a better horseman/woman.
